This group will be looking at how to increase participation our racing programs, our cruising programs, and working to make the club-owned boats more accessible to members. The committee will also be involved with the planning for the Adult Learn to Sail Program, as well as looking at potential additional club sailboats and how they could be leveraged into increasing participation. As you can see, that group will be busy. If you are interested in getting involved, let Lisa Baker know.

FROM THE VICE COMMODORE

Happy New Year! I hope everyone has heard about the changes happening with our new billing system and that you are at least excited about online billing! It's been a long year getting ready for this transition, and while I'm sure we will have some bumps and hiccups, I'm also sure it will be taking the club in a positive direction. If you have any questions during this time, please don't hesitate to contact me or any of the flag officers.

As a result of the new billing system and due to some rules being outdated or no longer necessary, the Board of Stewards recently updated and approved the Rules and Regulations. Please take the time to read over them. A change to the Club bylaws was also recommended and then approved by the membership at the annual meeting. It changed one word in Article VII, Section 4 on page 13 - from "quarter" to "day". It now reads "New members shall be liable for payment of dues beginning with the day in which they join in addition to payment of any initiation fee".

I've been at this commodore thing for a year now and I've discovered having goals – and telling people about them - drives me to get things done. I want to talk about two goals I have as Vice Commodore for 2020.

Club Sailboats

One of the perks of being a club member, and a hook for potential members, are our club sailboats. Besides knowing we can use the 420's that are on the junior dock, I hear these questions all the time: Which ones are club boats? How can we get on the list to use them? Where is the equipment to be able to use these boats and how do we rig them? Wait, we have club sailboats? My goal is to answer all these questions and more as well as have the information easily accessible on the website.

Anyone interested in helping, shoot me an email. I will definitely need guidance in the rigging department so let me know if that's your forte. I hope to get this completed in the first half of the year – but I can only do that with your help.

Adult Learn to Sail

In 2019, then-Commodore Tim Crane facilitated looking into ways to expand this program. While we got answers to a good many questions regarding this endeavor, there are still some to be answered. We need to decide what we want to teach and whether we would provide certifications to the students. Do we want different levels of instruction from beginner to racing? How will we market our program to attract students and new members?

The basic plan is to have up to six classes a year with enough instructors certified so they only teach one class a year. Like the junior program, the Club would cover the cost of their certification. In addition to volunteer instructors, we will need someone to manage Adult Learn to Sail.

But first, before we start certifying instructors, we need a variety of people to come together and answer these questions. If you'd like to instruct, let me know. If you'd like to manage, let me know. If you have thoughts and ideas about this subject but don't want to instruct or manage, we need you too, so let me know!

As I write this, we have had no takers on Sailing Chairman so I am taking the liberty of scheduling the next Sailing Committee meeting for January 18 at 1400 in the clubhouse, after the Racing Rules of Sailing class, led by Robert Kaiser. Only the above two topics will be tackled at the first meeting of the year. Everyone is welcome to attend, even if you are not "officially" on the Sailing Committee. See you there!

Racing Rules Seminar

We are scheduling a Rules Seminar for Saturday, January 18th at the WCSC clubhouse. The class will start at 9:00 AM and will be taught by Bob Kaiser from KSC. Bob has extensive rules background and is a US Sailing accredited Judge. If you want to learn more about the Racing Rules of Sailing and get into the details about the basic rules, plan on attending the course.

Race Management Course

WCSC will be hosting a Race Management Course on Saturday, February 29th. The class will start at 9:00 AM and will last about 3-4 hours. Coffee and donuts will be served before/during class and there will be ice cold beer and pizza immediately following the class.

The class will be a version of the US Sailing Race Officer training class but with a slant towards Race Management at WCSC on Lake Hartwell. It will also be a great course if you are new to racing or want to learn what you need to know to be great on Race Committee.

NEW CLUB BILLING SYSTEM & FAQS

In case you were not aware, after 35+ years of effort, Mary Ann Caldwell is retiring. A big thank you to Mary Ann for her years of dedication, help and support of the club billing system. What does that mean to you and to the club? Well, we will be moving to a new billing system on January 1st. This article will help communicate and identify changes that are occurring starting January 1st that may impact you. Please take a few minutes to read through the changes. If you have any questions, feel free to contact the Flag officers.

Some key things to remember:

Probably the most significant thing to remember and to change is where your quarterly payment will be sent to. In early January, you will receive an invoice for your club dues and equipment charges. On that invoice will be the new 'remit to' address. If you use online bill payment, please make sure you change the 'remit to' address on your bank's payment system for Western Carolina Sailing Club. If you mail a check, please make sure it is sent to the correct address. The new address for club payments will be:

WCSC c/o The Alliances 1205 N. Fant Street Anderson, SC 29621

If you send your payment to the old payment address, we cannot guarantee that your payment will be forwarded to the new billing administrator and it is possible that it could be late and you will be charged a late fee. Please make the changes before the January invoice payment date.

All Communications to Club Officers and administrators will be done using the Club web site. With Mary Ann retiring, all communications that would have been directed to her via email, phone or any other way, will be changing. In the past, many of our members would call her to ask questions about their invoice, other billing questions, fair share questions, equipment changes, etc. Starting January 1st, all communications will be to the Club Officers and administrators using the club website web forms. These forms will be filled out and when submitted, they will be routed to the respective owner or administrator at the club. That officer;/ administrator will be responsible for handling your question or request and responding to you in a timely manner. All the forms are located on the Club FAQ page, and there are more details are on the club website.

Equipment Billing Changes

We are changing the way we bill for equipment (dry stored boats, trailers, campers, etc.) and will start billing our membership quarterly. This amount will be rounded to the next whole dollar. For instance, if you have a large boat and that fee is \$83 annually, we will start charging \$21 quarterly. Also note that a report of your equipment will be provided with your invoice so you can validate what you are being billed for. If the equipment inventory is incorrect, please communicate any errors or changes to the club using the Invoice Question FAQ on the club website or the Dry Storage FAQs on the website.

To communicate any equipment changes (new equipment, updates, sold equipment, etc.), please go to the club website and fill out and provide updated information about your boat, camper, etc. That information will be sent to the club storage administrators and they will respond to you. **Note:** do not bring any equipment to the club without notifying our club storage administrators and receiving a decal and storage location. Please help us keep the club inventory (and your invoice) accurate. Also note that a fine system has been implemented for any equipment being stored at the club without a sticker/decal, so just to repeat: do not bring any equipment to the club without notifying our club storage administrators. The website location to communicate club equipment changes is at www.wcsc-sailing.org and on the home menu link as FAQ.

Club FAQs

Our 2019 Rear Commodore Lisa Baker has done a great job in setting up a club FAQ. This Frequently Asked Question section of the website covers a lot of different areas and administration of the club including:

- Camper Village information, waiting list additions, and who to contact for more information
- Club Boats and who to contact
- Club documentation including WCSC Bylaws and Rules and Regulations (which have been changed and updated)
- Clubhouse use and request forms
- Club Billing System questions, invoice errors and forms
- Dock Slip Storage information, waiting list, and who to contact for more information
- Dry Storage rules, forms, change requests
- Forums
- Moorings and who to contact for more information
- Pet Policy
- Work Area and who to contact for more information

Take a minute to check out the FAQs page. It's the place to go if you have any questions about anything club-related. You must be logged on as a member to view the club FAQs; the link is on the home page.

Membership Address, Email, and Other Profile Udates

In the past, if you moved or changed your email address, you would send an email to Mary Ann. Starting January 1st, any address, email or other profile updates will be completed on the club website. See the article on the club website for more details and screen shots.

Online Billing and pPayment

One of the key features we want to roll out with the new system is the ability to receive your invoice via email and give you the ability to pay the invoice online. This new feature is optional to all members; for you paper lovers, you can still receive your quarterly invoice via printed paper and USPS delivery. We would love for you to consider the online option and will be allowing members to enroll starting in February. Look for more information on how to enroll after the first of the year.

New Rules and Changes You Need to be Aware of

Our BOS recently did a complete review of the club rules and regs. Some of the rules and changes help us administer the new billing system. Other changes were done to clean up wording and to address potential issues. I would strongly encourage you to review the summarized changes below and review the complete rules and regulations on the club web site. You can find that link in the club FAQs.

Some key updates and changes are:

- Boats stored on club property shall be in reasonable sailing condition
- No member shall place any equipment or mooring on club property without receiving a space assignment from the appropriate administrator. That means you must have a decal/sticker on your equipment and you are required to communicate with the storage administrator before bringing any property onsite
- Storage fees will be pro-rated by quarter i.e., if you remove your boat from the property in May, you will not receive a refund for that quarter.
- There will be a \$25 fine if decals are not properly displayed within the current invoice quarter after issue or if permission to bring equipment to the club was not received in advance
- There will be a \$40 charge for each returned check
- There will be a \$25 late fee for any open balance on the first day of the month
- After 90 days of an open balance, the member's gate code and club privileges are suspended
- Members' children under the age of 18 cannot contribute toward the fair share requirement
- Only members volunteering for race committee, after completing their regular race committee duty, will be credited fair share hours. Members who serve both days of a 2 day regatta will continue to receive 10 fair share hours. Fair share will not be credited to a member substituting for another members' assigned race committee duty. These rules apply to PRO's as well.
- A dog that is aggressive towards humans OR another dog will immediately be banned from the property. No more second chances.
